**Pridgen - Historic Landmark and Districts for Michigan Ave
African American Heritage Corridor**

Whereas, the Michigan Avenue African American Heritage Corridor is a nationally and internationally recognized neighborhood in The City of Buffalo;

Whereas Michigan Avenue is an historical African American corridor that includes sites such as the Michigan Street Baptist Church, The Rev. Jesse E. Nash House Museum, The Colored Musician Club, and the Langston Hughes Institute;

Whereas, this corridor displays the rich historical, cultural and societal significance of African Americans in The City;

Whereas, The Corridor is worthy of preservation and the protections that are awarded with such designation: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved that The City of Buffalo Common Council-

- 1) Effective immediately, directs its Central Staff to begin work in coordination with preservationists, subject matter experts, and community stakeholders on land-marking historic sites and parcels along the Michigan Street Corridor that are relevant to African American history in The City.
